1. Introduction

1. Introduction

The WP8 is about the Consolidation & Enlargement of Membership and Partnership of MIRRI, which is crucial for MIRRI's sustainability. For this reason, WP8 will implement a well-planned approach to increase the number of countries engaged in the RI with a financial contribution, and to enlarge the mBRCs and CCs partner base. The underlying reasons of countries not willing to join MIRRI will be inquired and registered. This will allow the team to understand and analyze such motives and share experiences from engaged countries to better explain the advantages of becoming a MIRRI Member in order to attract them. A tailored plan on the ways to adapt MIRRI's offer accommodating specific country requirements (e.g. adaptation of services among others) could also be considered. This will help bringing on board the initially not committed countries in the long-term.

This deliverable reports the creation of a MIRRI group of representatives providing a forum to discuss membership and partnership issues with new mBRCs and Decision-Makers.

1.1. Objectives

WP8 (enlarge the membership of MIRRI) aims to consolidate the Members that have already signed the MoU, to strengthen, support, and consolidate existing Partners' collections and to stimulate new engagements at all levels (Members, partners, and other stakeholders). For this, the task proposed in the frame of this WP will promote enlargement of membership, organization of activities aiming to integrate local/national collections, industrial engagement, and rising of decision-makers' awareness.

The main objective of this D8.1 is to create a group out of the consortium partners and third parties to ensure a successful implementation of the enlargement and consolidation plan, as the main goal of the WP8.

1.2. Methodology

At the Kick-off Meeting of the IS_MIRRI21 project, which took place on the 25 and 26 March 2020, the WP8 Session – Consolidation & Enlargement was presented. During the WP8 session, it was concluded that the creation of the WP8-Working Group (WG) among the Partners is a key-element in well organizing the next steps of the WP8 and next deliverables.

At the Kick-off Meeting, IAFB proposed that all partners, as far as possible, should select one representative which will be in the WP8-WG.

One week after the teleconference was given as a deadline for submitting the representatives' names.

2.1. The mission of the Working Group within WP8

The main mission of this WP8-WG is to collaborate and share with the WP8 Leader the information about potential partners. The contact person will be directly involved in the process of membership enlargement and workshops organized within the WP8, to enhance the international cooperation and strengthen the national partnership between collections.

As a starting point, and taking into account the strong cooperation with the European Culture Collections Organisation (ECCO, www.eccosite.org), the most active ECCO Corporate Members of different European countries that did not yet sign the MoU (Table 2) will be contacted first. These mBRCs and their country representatives will be the top priority for the engagement.

In the case of country rejections, the underlying reasons for not wanting to join will be inquired and registered. This will allow the team to understand and analyze such motives and conceive a plan on the ways to adapt MIRRI's offer accommodating specific country needs (e.g. adapt services or other) and sharing experiences in other countries to better show the mutual advantages of becoming a MIRRI member. This will help bring on board in the long-term the initially not interested countries.
